PIKE PLACE MARKET

Located six blocks west of the Sheraton, this world-famous open air market features everything from fish-throwing seafood mongers to produce, flowers, restaurants and artists of all kinds.

THE GREAT WHEEL

Located below Pike Street Market on Pier 57 this gondola-style Ferris wheel offers a view of the city, the harbor and the Olympic Mountains.

WINGS OVER WASHINGTON

WOODLAND PARK ZOO

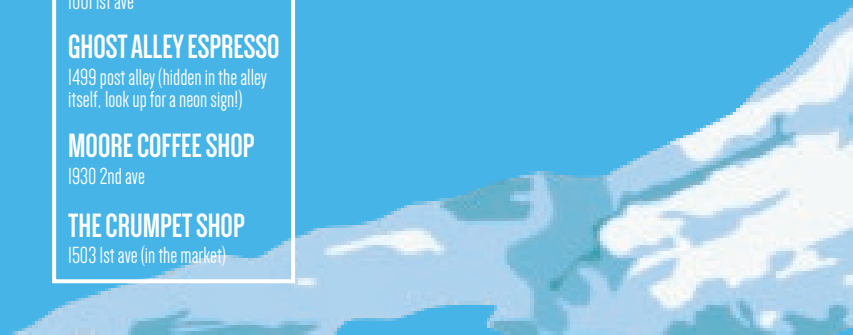
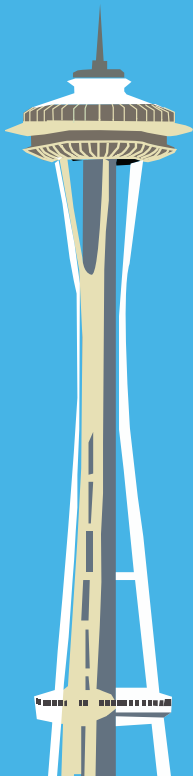
Located six miles north of downtown, Seattle's 92-acre wildlife park is home to 300 species and 1100 different animals, with many exhibits featuring natural habitat. The newest attraction highlights the animals of Asia's forests.

BURKE MUSEUM

On the University of Washington campus, the oldest public museum in Washington State, the Burke Museum is home to all things Native American for Seattle. Stop by and learn about our state's indigenous history.

AT THE SEATTLE CENTER

SEATTLE CENTER MONORAIL

This elevated train, installed for the 1962 Seattle World's Fair, travels between Westlake Center and the Seattle Center, site of the fairgrounds and its landmark Space Needle.

HOURS: 8:30 A.M. - 11:30 P.M. DAILY

MUSEUM OF POP CULTURE

Formerly known as the Experience Music Project, MoPOP is home to exhibits ranging from 55 vintage guitars from the 1770's to the present, and the careers of Jimi Hendricks and Nirvana to the "Fantasy: Worlds of Myth and Magic" including weaponry from Lord Of The Rings, costumes from Harry Potter and scripts from Game of Thrones.

SPACE NEEDLE

This 605-foot tower features an observation deck giving visitors a 360 degree view of the city and its surrounding mountains, lakes and Puget Sound.

This iconic, 75-minute walking tour takes you past storefronts and walkways entombed after the city was reconstructed after a devastating fire in 1889.
